

# 2015 Kane-DuPage Soil & Water Stewardship Poster Contest

Sponsored by the Kane-DuPage Soil and Water Conservation District



The Kane-DuPage Soil and Water Stewardship Poster Contest provides school students with an opportunity to share their thoughts about natural resource issues.

## Eligibility

The Soil and Water Stewardship Poster Contest is open to all K-12 public, private, or home school students that live in Kane and DuPage Counties.

## Prizes

A gift card of \$25 will be awarded to the grand-prize winner and a \$15 gift card will be awarded to the first runner-up in the K-1, 2-3 and 4-6 grade divisions. A \$50 gift certificate will be awarded to the grand-prize winner and a \$25 gift certificate will be awarded to the first runner-up in 7-9 and 10-12 grade division.

Grand prize winners will be notified in late May. Grand prize posters from each grade division will compete in the Association of Illinois Soil and Water Conservation District's Auxiliary Poster contest with the possibility of advancing to the National Conservation Poster Contest.

## Contest Rules

- Any media (paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, paper) may be used to create a flat or two-dimensional effect. However, posters should be able to be shipped flat.
- Posters must be between 8.5"X11" and 22"x28" in size.
- Posters must be original works by individual students. Artwork may not be copied or duplicated published art including copyright free images.
- Posters should reflect the theme. The 2015 Stewardship title "**Local Heros-Your Hardworking Pollinators**" must be on the poster. The title can be with or without a hyphen.
- All posters must have a completed entry form attached to the back of the poster.
- Posters must be mailed or delivered to the Kane-DuPage Soil and Water Conservation District office, 2315 Dean St. Suite 100, St.Charles no later than Friday, May 1.

## Theme

The theme for this year's contest is "**Local Heros-Your Hard Working Pollinators**". Worldwide roughly 1000 plants are grown for food, beverages, fiber, and medicine that need to be pollinated by animals. In the

United States pollination by native insects results in \$40 billion worth of products each year. These important animals are being threatened due to habitat loss, chemical misuse, and invasive species.

## Judging

Posters entered in the Soil and Water Stewardship poster contest will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Conservation message**  
50 percent
- Visual effectiveness**  
30 percent
- Originality**  
10 percent
- Universal appeal**  
10 percent
